RELATING TO STATE MEDICAL BOARD.

An Act relating to the practice of medicine, surgery, osteopathy and other modes of treating the sick and afflicted, and amending section 8393 of Remington & Ballinger's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Washington.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

Section 1. That section 8393 of Remington & Ballinger's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Washington be amended to read as follows: Section 8393. Each applicant, on making application, shall pay the secretary of the board a fee of twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, which shall be turned over to the treasurer of the board, who shall retain fifteen (\$15.00) dollars for the fee in his possession until the board shall have passed upon the credentials of the applicant, and in case they are insufficient the sum of fifteen (\$15.00) dollars shall be returned upon application.

All money received or collected by said board or any member or officer thereof, during any month, shall be turned over, before the tenth day of the succeeding month to the state treasurer together with a verified statement showing the sources from which such money was derived.
