CHAPTER 1.

[S. B. 1]

APPROPRIATION—EXPENSES OF LEGISLATURE.

AN ACT appropriating the sum of three hundred eighty thousand dollars for the actual and necessary expenses of the legislature, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Washington:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the general fund the sum of three hundred eighty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of paying the expenses, except legislative printing, of the thirty-fifth legislature. From the amount hereof appropriated the Senate shall not expend more than one hundred seventy five thousand dollars; the House of Representatives shall not expend more than two hundred five thousand dollars. Appropriation.

SEC. 2. None of the funds appropriated herein shall be expended by or for the legislative council, the legislative budget committee or any other legislative interim committee. Prohibited expenditures.

SEC. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate support of the state government and shall take effect immediately. Emergency.
